MESSAGE FROM CANTOR JEN ROHER

Spring at the Temple!

Spring at the Temple brings lots of exciting events, like Purim, Passover, the Confirmation trip... and planting our Temple garden. This year, we are introducing a very exciting new addition to our outdoor garden space which will bring a lot of new life and excitement to the Temple... a chicken coop!

The coop will be constructed by our talented Men's Club. "We get so bored in the spring," said a representative of the Men's Club, "In the Fall we love building and taking down the Sukkah. But we don't have any good spring projects. We are so excited to design and build the Temple Chicken Coop."

After construction is completed in mid-March, our four initial chicks will arrive and get settled. They will be traveling down from Wisconsin after being born at the new home of Rabbi Sam, who, if you hadn't heard, has started raising chickens.

Before long, our chickens will be able to provide eggs for our Mitzvah Meals, and wonderful opportunities for our children and young families to take care of animals. Shifts will be available to sign up to take care of the chickens. This will fulfill the commandment to take care of animals, "tz'ar ba'alei hachayim."

Most exciting is that once they are grown, I am planning to teach the chickens to sing, and they will be able to participate in Shabbat services as our brand new Temple Chicken Choir aka, "The Coop Troop." We plan to name them Mordechai, Esther, Ahasuerus, and Vashti.

If they do well with the singing, maybe we could even form a chicken band, "Rock Around The Cluck." We can get a little chicken guitar, let them stomp around on the drums and peck at the keys of the piano. Then, we can teach them the Chicken Dance and start booking them for B'nei Mitzvah and wedding parties.

"At first, I thought this was a terrible idea," said Lynn Nusbaum. "But then I went and visited Rabbi Sam at his new place, and one of the chickens came right up to me and handed me a bag of cheese curds, and it just seemed so nice."

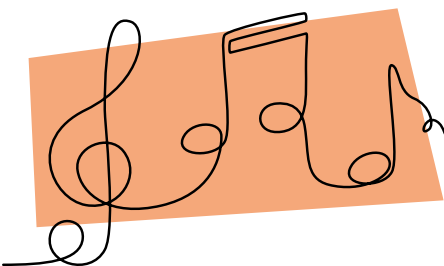

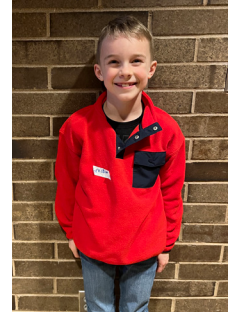

Fourth-Sixth Grade Immigration Lesson Wrap-Up

Our last lesson on immigration for the year wrapped up last week. The students wrote paragraphs about what they learned and how they felt going through the experiences. We asked the student's permission to publish their writings and they are printed below.

*When people went to Ellis Island it was a very long process. First you would pack only a couple of items and you had to say goodbye to everyone and everything. Next, you had to ride or walk to the other side of Britain to get to the boat. It took nineteen days to get to Ellis Island. After that you would have to check for if you are sick or healthy and you had to know a couple of English words and have money. You also had to take care of your kids. When you get to Ellis Island you have to find a home, get money, find a job, get food, and figure out how to communicate with your family back home. These are some of the challenges people went through when immigrating through Ellis Island. -**Madelyn Freed***

*"Can I bring this mom?" "No, we don't have enough room! We must go now. We have a long journey ahead of us." When people were getting ready to leave, they had to decide which few items to bring with them. Most of the time Immigrants lived on the opposite side of the country and had to travel long distances to get to the boat. "When are we going to get through this line?" Immigrants had to wait for hours to get through one line. There was always the risk of getting deported if you didn't have enough money, health issues, not knowing enough of the language etc. If you were lucky enough to be able to get to America you needed to find a job, shelter, food, etc. Immigrants had to face discrimination and the difficulties of being judged by Americans. "Mom when will I get to go back to school?" "I don't know." If you went over to America, you had to make sure your children were getting a proper education. There were many challenges involved in going to America including discrimination, getting a job, getting to the boat, finding shelter, and getting your kids an education. -**Sophie Hamilton***

*The trip to Ellis Island from Poland was a tough and gritty one for the Jews traveling there. Many were deported and if you made it into America, you made very little money. The Jews went through discrimination and violence was common. Immigrants often traveled without their family and did not see family again for years. Apartments were often very crowded, and some people even slept on the floor. -**Max Gray***
