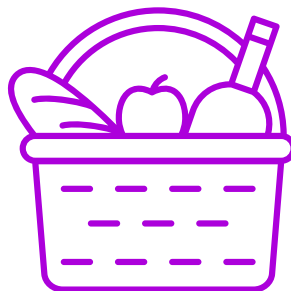

MESSAGE FROM RABBI LISA DELSON

Do Justice, Love Mercy, Walk Humbly with God

“Do justice, love mercy, walk humbly with your God.” Micah 6:8 The prophets of the Hebrew Bible, Micah included, that we should be concerned with our actions, how we show up in our lives. They spoke in contrast to the highly ordered ways that the priests performed their duties in the Temple in Jerusalem. The prophets wanted us to be good people, worship only one God and take care of each other. Their messages varied due to their locations and situations but overall their message was the same. The Reform Movement, since its inception, has followed the path of the prophets, using their words to guide our actions. How can we do justice? What does it mean to love mercy? How do we, as a community, walk with God? I believe this is one of the core messages of what it means to be a Jewish person today. We have the ability to make the world a better place through our action, advocacy, and attention.

Last month, Jeanine Huttner and I sat around a table with 20 fellow congregants to see what social action and social justice opportunities we can create here at the Temple. We thought about what brought us to this place and time and why do we care so deeply about making a difference. Each person offered their own impetus for attending and it was clear that there is excitement about what we can, collectively, do. Every other month we plan to meet to discuss the best ways for our entire congregation to engage in making the world a better place. This committee is not just for these 20 people to do the work, it is intended to make space for everyone, if they would like, to participate.

As of right now, we have identified four areas in which we intend to organize.

- 1. Social Action** - This month, on May 18, we are partnering with Christ Presbyterian Church in a program called, “Let’s Build Beds,” building beds for children ages 3-17 who are in need in our area. We are also collecting bedding to accompany the new beds.
- 2. Social Justice** - Joining with the Religious Action Center of Ohio, the Union for Reform Judaism’s social justice arm, we are learning more about the nonpartisan Citizens Not Politicians Campaign and also planning to write postcards for Reproductive Rights in Florida. For more information both of these visit rac.org
- 3. Multifaith/Interfaith** - Our congregation has a long history of partnering with the Muslim Community in Toledo, from serving at food banks to hosting Iftar dinners and Chanukah parties. We are also a part of the Multifaith Council in Toledo, which offers us opportunities to get to know our neighbors, celebrating our similarities and differences.
- 4. Partners in Education** - In the past our congregation, under the leadership of Jay Mirrow, has participated in this tutoring program for students in the Toledo Public schools. We are considering how we might want to bring this back to the temple community.

All of these projects and programs need YOU! When we do justice and love mercy, we are walking humbly with God, partnering to make the world a better place. Please join us as we embark on these actions together.

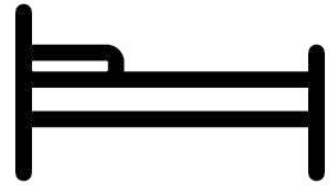

On Israel Independence Day, Arielle drives the train from one end of Jerusalem to the other. Her brother Ezra is a pilot in the Israel Air Force. Arielle has a big surprise on top of her train for Ezra. She has attached a huge sign saying: YOM HA'ATZMA'UT SAMEACH, EZRA! (HAPPY INDEPENDENCE DAY, EZRA!)

When Ezra sees this, he dips his plane low toward the train bridge and waves to her from the cockpit.

FOR ADULTS :

2). **MY RUSSIAN GRANDMOTHER AND HER AMERICAN VACUUM CLEANER, A FAMILY MEMOIR** by Meir Shalev. (One of Israel's best writers) Translated from the Hebrew by Evan Fallenberg.

Shalev grew up on the famously Socialist Kibbutz Nahalal. His Grandmother Tonia was always cleaning every speck of dirt she saw. Dust and dirt were everywhere. Grandmother always carried a cleaning rag with her to catch any bit of dirt that came into her house. Shalev's Great-uncle had emigrated to Los Angeles and sent her a big, shiny American sweeper. This is the story of this "svieeperr" and the scandal it caused at the kibbutz. I loved this book.
